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Welcome to Origin's 2022 Christmas Special

It's very nearly Christmas!

To be honest, it's been 'very nearly Christmas' in my house since late July, which is when I started choosing music for tonight's event. But far from being tired of the Christmas music, something wonderful happens as we get closer and closer to the day we celebrate Jesus' birth.

It's not that He was born on 25 December (it was probably September or October), and it's not that we don't rejoice in His birth all the rest of the year. It's just good to have a day where we mark it - and 25 December is as good as any other for that. It's the King's 'official' birthday.

The surprising fact about Jesus is that, if you are one of His followers, He is your brother, not only your King. And it's good to celebrate the birth of your brother each year. I know there are some who don't, and to those few who object to Christmas on the grounds that it's gone all commercial – I get it. We hate that too. But that shouldn't stop us gathering around the manger to worship. To those who object because that 25 December was once a pagan holiday. I don't get it. So what? Why do we care what other people celebrate on that day?

Tonight, we gather for one reason only – to celebrate the birth of the One who was born to die in our place. Let that sink in for a moment. The reason for His birth was His death. As we bow down tonight, that fact should add a dimension of gratitude beyond anything we could normally experience. It was for us.

Now if you'll permit me - towards the end of 1997, I presented an idea to the board at Carrubbers Christian Centre, the elders at Charlotte Chapel and Bellevue Evangelical Church. What came out of that was the ministry that brings you tonight's event.

In 25 years much has changed, but the message and the mission remains the same.

We have launched a fundraising partnership to enable Origin to continue working for Jesus into the future. These are challenging times for all of us, and so it is with gratitude that we acknowledge those who give to support the ministry. We are 100% donor supported. 







One-off donations - £20,000
